- The data required on this form should be neatly and accurately copied from the "Service Record" of each enlisted man on board of a vessel or attached to a station and filed alphabetically in the loose-leaf binder; subsequent entries in the service record should be noted on the corresponding leaf in the binder.
- When an enlisted man is to be transferred, his service record and his leaf in the binder should be completed to the date of such transfer, the service record forwarded to the vessel or station to which he is transferred, and his leaf in the binder detached at the perforations and immediately forwarded to the Bureau. The commanding officer receiving the man will at once have a leaf inserted in the binder of that vessel or station, noting thereon all the information regarding enlistment, for purposes of identification, but the entries for professional qualifications, conduct, offenses, and punishments will include only the period of service on board of the particular vessel or at the station.
- When a man is recommended for first advancement to the rating of petty officer, a copy of Form 1-B, on file in the "binder," completed to the date of such recommendation, should be forwarded to the Bureau, but subsequent recommendations for advancement, except to the rating of chief petty officer, need only report the record of the man from one advancement to another. When the recommendation is for permanent appointment as chief petty officer, a complete record of current enlistment, to date of recommendation, showing names of vessels on which service has been performed, and all other information required by Form 1-B, together with the report of the Board, signed by all the members, should be forwarded to the Bureau.
- Upon the expiration of the original four years of a man who extends his enlistment, his entire service of four years shall be transcribed on a Form 1-B, which should be forwarded to the Bureau with red ink notation on the indorsement fold "Enlistment extended, transcript of original four-year enlistment." The original Form 1-B or ledger leaf will be retained in the ledger.
- Under "Authority" on the indorsement fold the reason for the advancement or reduction of the man should be given in full, making reference to correspondence, Navy Regulations, or the Bureau's circular, as the case may be. If appointment is issued to fill a vacancy, this should also be shown.
- This form is to be filled out on the typewriter whenever practicable. If written by hand, care should be used in writing names and dates correctly and making every letter and figure legible.
- This form must, in every case when sent to the Bureau of Navigation, be folded twice, with the indorsement fold outside.

In the First Place, I agree for the considerations hereinafter mentioned to enter the service of the Navy of the United States, and in due and seasonable time to repair on board such vessel of the Navy or to such station as I may be ordered to join, and to the utmost of my power and ability discharge my several services or duties, and be in everything conformable and obedient to the several requirings and lawful commands of the officers who may from time to time be placed over me.

Secondly, I oblige and subject myself to serve { four years from OCT 27 1917, I, unless sooner during minority, until, 19 } discharged by proper authority, and on the conditions provided by the act of Congress "to amend Section 1422 of the Revised Statutes of the United States relating to the better government of the Navy," approved March 3, 1875, in the following words, to wit:

SEC. 1422. That it shall be the duty of the commanding officer of any fleet, squadron, or vessel acting singly, when on service, to send to an Atlantic or to a Pacific port of the United States, as their enlistment may have occurred on either the Atlantic or Pacific coast of the United States, in some public or other vessel, all petty officers and persons of inferior ratings desiring to go there at the expiration of their terms of enlistment, or as soon thereafter as may be, unless, in his opinion, the detention of such persons for a longer period should be essential to the public interests, in which case he may detain them, or any of them, until the vessel to which they belong shall return to such Atlantic or Pacific port. All persons enlisted without the limits of the United States may be discharged, on the expiration of their enlistment, either in a foreign port or in a port of the United States, or they may be detained as above provided beyond the term of their enlistment; and that all persons sent home, or detained by a commanding officer, according to the provisions of this act, shall be subject in all respects to the laws and regulations for the government of the Navy until their return to an Atlantic or Pacific port and their regular discharge; and all persons so detained by such officer, or reentering to serve until the return to an Atlantic or Pacific port of the vessel to which they belong, shall in no case be held in the service more than thirty days after their arrival in said port; and that all persons who shall be so detained beyond their terms of enlistment, or who shall after the termination of their enlistment, voluntarily reenter to serve until the return to an Atlantic or Pacific port of the vessel to which they belong and their regular discharge therefrom, shall receive for the time during which they are so detained, or shall so serve beyond their original terms of enlistment, an addition of one-fourth of their former pay: Provided, That the shipping articles shall hereafter contain the substance of this section.

And I also oblige myself, during such service, to comply with and be subject to, such laws, regulations, and discipline of the Navy as are or shall be established by the Congress of the United States or other competent authority, and to submit to treatment for the prevention of Smallpox, Typhoid (Typhoid Prophylaxis) and to such other preventive measures as may be considered necessary by the Naval Authorities. If discharged by sentence of General Court Martial, I agree to surrender uniform in exchange for civilian clothing, or if discharged by reason of bad conduct, undesirability or for inaptitude, I agree to surrender uniform.

Thirdly, I have had the Shipping Articles fully explained to me, understand them, and certify that no promise of any kind has been made to me concerning assignment to duty or promotion during my enlistment.

Fourthly, The said Comr. Walter Ball, U. S. N. (Ret'd) for and in behalf of the United States, does hereby covenant and agree to and with the said Eugene Albert Brownlow, who has hereunto signed his name, that he shall be paid, in consideration of such services, Twenty-four & 20/100 dollars per month from date of enlistment, or the wages due to the ratings which may, from time to time, be assigned to him during the continuance of his service aforesaid.

INSTRUCTIONS.

BUREAU OF NAVIGATION, NAVY DEPARTMENT,

October 30, 1916.

1. Great care must be exercised in marking men for their professional qualifications and conduct, as these marks, and the recommendations of Commanding Officers regarding Honorable Discharge and Good Conduct Medal, are the guides by which the Department judges of the fitness of men for the service, and for the positions of Petty and Warrant Officers. Columns for recommendations for "Honorable Discharge," "Good Conduct Medal," "Reenlistment," and "Rating by Executive Officer" are provided in their respective columns.

(a) Marks for performance of duty as showing the results of all the particular duties performed.

(b) Marks for usefulness of a man as shown by his knowledge of his particular duties.

(c) Marks for intelligence of a man as shown by his use of intelligence of the use and care of guns, mortars, and every described weapon upon the knowledge of the use and care of electrical machinery and appliances, and ordnance.

(d) Marks for intelligence of a man as shown by his use of intelligence of the use and care of small arms.

(e) The entries provided in the columns for "Honorable Discharge," "Good Conduct Medal," "Reenlistment," and "Rating by Executive Officer" shall be as provided in the columns for "Honorable Discharge," "Good Conduct Medal," "Reenlistment," and "Rating by Executive Officer" respectively.

(f) Marks for knowledge of electrical machinery and appliances, and ordnance.

(g) Marks for ability as leader of men are to be given men of all ratings, except landsmen, apprentice seamen, seamen second class, and firemen third class.

2. Commanding officers must pay particular attention to marks for sobriety and obedience and resulting recommendations for Honorable Discharge and Good Conduct Medal, in order that equal weights will be given for equally grave offenses and strict justice accorded the enlisted man.

When a mark below 4.0 is assigned in sobriety or obedience for a quarter in which no offense is shown on the record, the cause for such action must be entered in the column of offenses.

3. Should the final recommendations regarding Honorable Discharge and Good Conduct Medal not accord with the record, due weight being given to the recommendations of all other captains under whom the man may have served during his current enlistment, as shown by his enlistment record, the commanding officer must state on the enlistment record clearly and concisely, over his own signature, the reasons for such recommendations.

4. In cases of men reenlisting immediately on board of the vessel from which discharged, an entry showing the original place of enlistment must be made on the enlistment record.

5. On pages 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, and 11 it will be noted that the lines are numbered. These pages take the place of the old form of enlistment record, and the entries at the "end of quarter," "transfer," etc., should be made on the same numbered lines if possible. The commanding officer's signature in the column "Signature of Commanding Officer" is an acknowledgment of all entries between the line on which his signature is placed and the last entry by himself or a previous commanding officer.

6. In the column "Meritorious Conduct, Offenses," etc., page 8, the commanding officer, on the transfer or discharge of a petty officer, first class, or chief petty officer, or upon his own detachment, shall note whether or not the man possesses qualifications for future consideration for appointment as a warrant officer. When petty officers of lower ratings are considered especially well fitted, this same note may be made on their records at the discretion of the commanding officer.

7. On page 12, "Details," note will be made in the proper column of the character of duty performed by the petty officers, with dates at the beginning and completion thereof, especially when regularly detailed in the following cases: Electricians detailed for wireless; gunners' mates for electrical work, battery, or torpedoes and mines; machinists' mates for ordnance or electrical work; quartermasters, whether for ship or signal; yeomen, whether for captain, executive, ordnance officer, navigator, equipment, engineer, or pay department, or in charge of ship's store; and any other detail showing special aptitude, knowledge of which would be valuable to succeeding commanding officers; musicians, note the instrument they play; also when a man is detailed as messman, compartment cleaner, jack-of-the-dust, ice-machine tender, evaporator tender, or other special detail, with period so detailed.

8. No interlineations, erasures, alterations, or use of ditto marks will be permitted. Should an error be made, a light red-ink line will be drawn through it, the commanding or executive officer entering his initials alongside in ink.

9. The signatures of commanding officers to all final entries on enlistment records closed by discharge, desertion, or death, and to every quarter in which a court-martial or change of rating has occurred, must be written, not stamped.

10. The stubs in the back of the book are for the insertion of the Gunnery Record and Appointments, which will be inserted with a view of removal and delivery to the man on his discharge, the perforated line being for detachment.

11. Attention is invited to the latest edition of Bureau's Annual Circular, "Information for Commanders-in-Chief, Division Commanders, Commandants, and Commanding Officers."

12. Absence from duty on account of sickness or diseases resulting from immoderate use of drugs or alcoholic liquors or other misconduct shall be noted on page 16 and attested by the signature of the Commanding Officer. The enlistment is not complete until such absence over one day is made good.

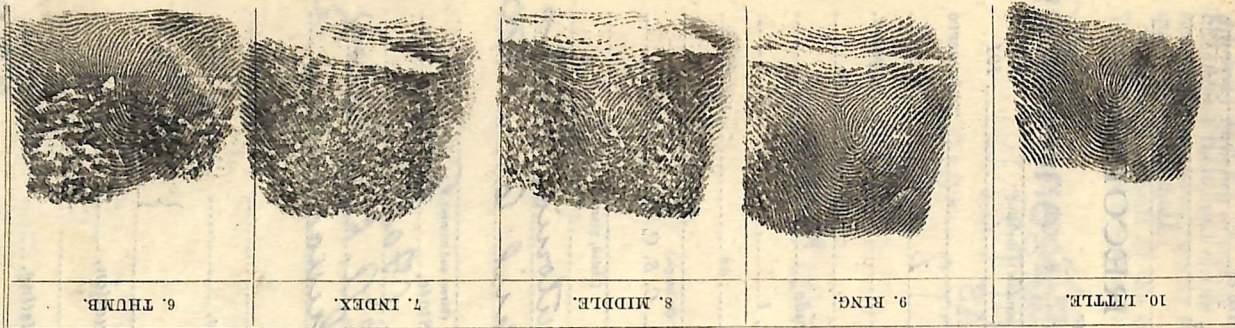

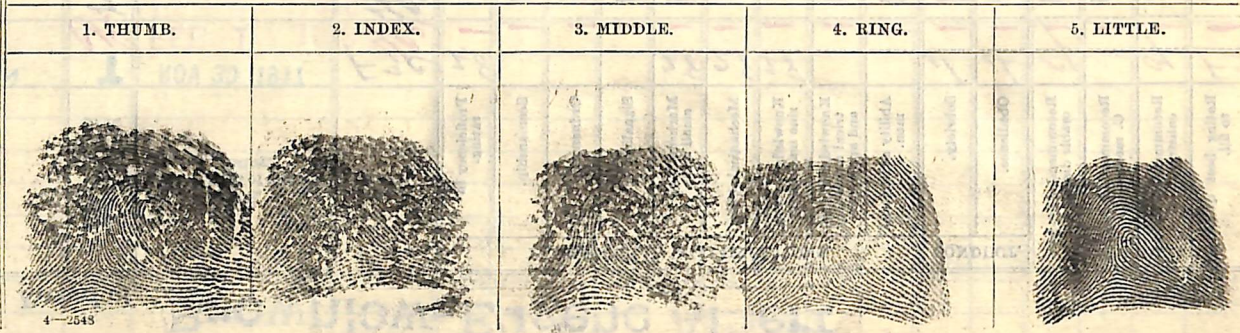

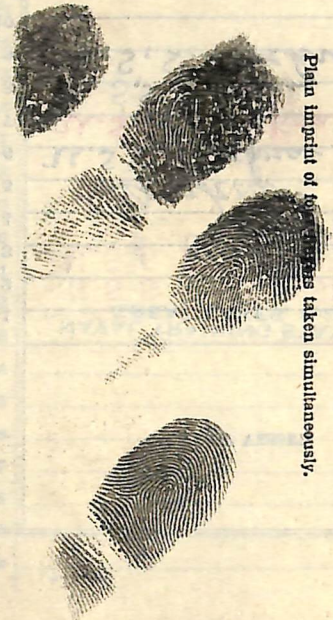
