**GRAVES**—Fort Worth, Tex., Oct. 11.—Andrew Graves, aged 25, of Nashville, Tenn., a consumptive, on his way to San Antonio, died at a hotel here this evening.

**CRISWELL**—Flatonla, Fayette Co., Tex., Oct. 8.—John Y. Criswell, an old resident of this county, a Texas veteran and ex-president of the Texas Veterans' association, died yesterday at Waco, where he had gone for his health. He was said to be 84 years old. The funeral took place to-day.

**DUNN**—Franklin, Tex., Oct. 11.—Mrs. Nancy J. Dunn, wife of the late George H. Dunn, died at her home near Wheelock last night. Her husband preceded her several months ago. She was one of the early settlers of this county and was noted throughout the county for her charities and her unselfish assistance to the poor. The joint estate of herself and deceased husband is estimated at about \$200,000. She leaves twelve children, a number of grandchildren and many friends, who will miss her kind, sympathetic presence.

**WHEELER**—Boston, Mass., Oct.—V. Crosby Wheeler, D. D., the well known missionary of the American board, died at Auburndale to-day. In his early life Dr. Wheeler was a pastor in Maine, but in 1837 he entered the missionary service in Turkey and was located at Harpool, where for thirty-nine years he labored indefatigably. He was founder and president of Euphrates college, and through this institution and in other ways he has wrought most successfully for the good of the Armenians.
