1. John Metz applied for letters of administration 16 Dec 1833. John Metz appointed administrator 23 Dec 1833. Nathaniel Smith of Newberry District died intestate lately having while he lived and at the time of death goods, rights, credits with South Carolina.
2. Inventory of Appraisement lists household goods and farm equipment, supplies, and utensils on three pages by appraisers Henry Dominick, M.L. Witt, John Long. Inventory total value is shown as \$242.535. Recorded in Book N, page 2 and 3, July 1, 1839, W. Wilson. OND.
3. A summary of accounts in 1834. Paid ordinary's fee and M. Hall for crying sales. Other names paid on notes: W. Lever, G. W. Mettz, M. Hill, Adam Mettz, F. Kempson, David Kibler, J. H. Stockman, Dan Caldwell, David Bowers, Elizabeth Paysinger, H. H. King, W. Lever as admor of May Lever, Spivee Smith on acct., J. W. Harmon. Jacob Frick making coffin. Total \$301.985.
